### 2.30 LAKH FAKE AADHAAR CARDS FOUND IN STATE

AP has earned the dubious distinction of having issued the highest number of bogus Aadhaar numbers in the country. Of the 3.84 lakh fake numbers nationwide, 2.3 lakh were from the state.

Unique Identification Authority of India officials have cancelled the fake numbers which were issued without taking biometrics such as fingerprints or iris scans.

Sources said the fake numbers were generated by enrolment agencies who misused the "biometric-exemption clause". While the clause is meant for rare cases where it's difficult to take fingerprints or iris scans (like for those suffering from leprosy or are blind), some agencies enrolled those who did not fall under this category.

Even under the exemption clause, the agencies are supposed to procure photographs and demographic information of those enrolled, but it seems the agencies provided fake information to earn extra money. The government pays around ₹50 for each Aadhaar number generated.

"Majority of the bogus Aadhaar numbers were issued in Nellore, Ongole and some areas of Hyderabad district... We have identified about six enrolment agencies involved in the fraud and have blacklisted them," said M.V.S. Rami Reddy, deputy director-general, UIDAI, AP.

Officials suspected foul play after nearly 50,000 cards were returned undelivered.

Other states where fake Aadhaar numbers were issued were Maharashtra (39,000), Jharkhand (33,000), TN (19,000), Odisha (18,000), Delhi (14,000) and UP (8,000).

### ZARDARI LIKELY TO WATCH PAK, INDIA EDEN TIE

# Girl cremated amid public fury

The girl who lit a fire in the hearts of billions was consigned to flames early on Sunday morning, hours after her body was flown home from Singapore.

In a ceremony kept out of public glare, her father lit the funeral pyre in the presence of his relatives and neighbours in a crematorium at Dwarka at 7.30 am.

Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and UPA chairperson Sonia Gandhi were at the airport to console the parents, who landed in India with their daughter's body at around 3.30 am.

The 23-year-old Delhi girl, who was brutally gang-raped in a moving bus, had waged a brave battle with death for 13 days.

Her cremation and journey back home was covered in a shroud of secrecy, as the government and police apprehended another wave of public fury against the ruling class.

The police, in fact, wanted the cremation to be carried out in Ballia or Varanasi. The government, which was accused of being "insensitive", refused the police proposal.

The Delhi police also wanted the cremation done before sunrise, sources said.

## Unable to bear loss, girl's mom collapses

DC CORRESPONDENT NEW DELHI, DEC. 30

The grief-stricken 46-year-old mother of the Delhi gang-rape victim collapsed on Sunday and was rushed to a hospital where she was treated for "grief effect" and discharged in the evening.

Doctors at the Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital in west Delhi confirmed that the woman underwent thorough check-ups and was doing "completely fine" now and left for home on Sunday evening. The woman went unconscious for some time

in the morning after the cremation of her daughter.

A senior doctor at DDU hospital said the woman was brought to the hospital at around 8.10 am and was rushed to the emergency department where she was treated. The doctors describe "grief effect" as a medical term for patients who suffer from grief and anxiety due to tragic incidents.

Dr S.P. Barua, medical superintendent of the hospital, said that the woman was frail and was not able to bear the loss of her daughter.

## PRAKASAM SEES TWO RAPES AND A BID TO RAPE

## UN offers aid on rape laws

The United Nations has offered technical expertise and support to India for strengthening critical services for rape victims and to bring about reforms in rape laws.

This is the first time that the United Nations has responded to a rape incident in India.

The recent gang-rape in Delhi and the victim's subsequent death has triggered international outrage forcing the United Nations to call on the Indian government to take further steps and reforms to deter such crimes and bring the perpetrators to justice.

UN secretary-general Ban Ki-moon on Sunday expressed "deep sorrow" at the death of the 23-year-old girl, who was gang-raped

by six men in a moving bus in Delhi on December 16. A statement by an official spokesperson said the secretary-general had offered his sincerest condolences to her parents, family and friends and utterly condemned this brutal crime.

"Violence against women must never be accepted, never excused, never tolerated. Every girl and woman has the right to be respected, valued and protected," Ban Ki-moon said, welcoming efforts of the Indian government to take urgent action.

He called for further steps and reforms to deter such crimes and bring the perpetrators to justice.

He also encouraged the government to strengthen critical services for rape victims.

## EXPERTS WARN OF MASSIVE QUAKES IN THE HIMALAYAS

Singapore, Dec. 30: In what could have huge implications for countries like India, scientists have warned of massive earthquakes of magnitude of 8 to 8.5 in the Himalayas, especially in areas where their surface is yet to be broken by a tumbler.

A research team led by Nanyang Technological University (NTU) here has discovered that powerful earthquakes in the range of 8 to 8.5 magnitude on the Richter scale have left clear ground scars in the central Himalayas.

This ground-breaking discovery has huge implications for the area along the front of the Himalayan mountains, given that the region has a population density similar to that of New York city, researchers said in a statement.

## HIMALAYAN ZONE IS QUAKE-PRONE DUE TO ITS HISTORY

PAUL TAPPONNIER, a leading neotectonics scientist, said that the existence of such devastating quakes in the past means that quakes of the same magnitude could happen again in the region in future, especially in areas which have yet to have their surface broken by a tumbler.

The study showed that in 1255 and 1934, two great earthquakes ruptured the surface of the earth in the Himalayas. This runs contrary to what scientists have previously thought.

Tapponnier said that by combining new high resolution imagery and state of the art dating techniques, they could show that the 1934 earthquake did indeed rupture the surface, breaking the ground over a length of more than 150 kilometres, essentially south of the part of the range that harbours Mount Everest.

## NY woman held for killing Indian

New York, Dec. 30: Two days after she shoved an Indian man to his death onto a subway train track here, a 31-year-old woman has been charged with "hate crime murder" as she admitted before police that she had pushed him because she "hated Hindus and Muslims".

Erika Menendez was ordered held without bail at her arraignment last night and appeared to express no remorse for her crime that left 46-year-old Sunando Sen dead.

Menendez was laughing in a maniacal manner during her arraignment, prompting an angry response from even the judge, the



*New York Daily News* said. The Queens resident started laughing as prosecutors read out her statements to authorities. "I spent time in Times Square. You will find me on the video. I wasn't in Queens," she said. She later claimed "I pushed a Muslim on the tracks." — PTI

## CHINA SET FOR COALITION WITH NON-COMMUNISTS

Beijing, Dec. 30: The ruling Communist Party of China (CPC), which has a monopolistic hold on power over the country for over six decades, has offered to have a "coalition" with eight officially approved non-communist parties as part of its reforms and opening up policies.

Yu Zhengsheng, a Standing Committee member of the Politburo of the CPC's Central Committee has stressed "coalition with non-communist parties," state-run *Xinhua* news agency reported. "As China faces the long-term underdevelopment of productive forces, we should strive to coordinate conflicting interests from different sides via cooperation," Yu said.

The senior leader also appealed to non-communist parties to give full play to their supervisory role, and urged the party at all levels to improve coordination.

Yu's comments come in the backdrop of comments by Xi Jinping in his first meeting with non-communist party leaders few days ago where he spoke about the danger of rot setting into his own party. — PTI

## Bush obituary published by German mag

Berlin, Dec. 30: Germany's respected news weekly *Der Spiegel* has mistakenly published an obituary for former U.S. President George H.W. Bush. The unfinished obituary appeared on *Der Spiegel's* website for only a few minutes Sunday before it was spotted by Internet users and removed.

In it, the magazine's New York correspondent Marc Pitzke describes Bush as "a colourless politician" whose image only improved when it was compared to the later presidency of his son, George W. Bush. Bush was hospitalized in Houston Nov. 23 for treatment of a bronchitis-related cough. He was moved to intensive care on December 23 after he developed a fever. A family spokesman says that he was moved out to a regular hospital room on Saturday. — AFP

## New fork that makes sounds while eating

London: Japanese researchers have developed a new talking fork that speaks different words and plays bizarre sounds while a person eats. The fork contains a micro controller, a speaker, amp-lifier and battery within its handle, and generates a variety of sounds depending on the type of food being eaten. The sounds are apparently generated by the resistance value of the food i.e. the noise it will produce when a chicken nugget is eaten sounds similar to a chicken clucking, the *Daily Mail* reported. — PTI

## Oldest carvings depicting pharaoh found

Washington: The oldest known representation of a pharaoh has been found carved on rocks at a desert site in southern Egypt, *Discovery News* reported. The images of the carvings found on vertical rocks at Nag el-Hamdulab, four miles north of the Aswan Dam, depict a pharaoh riding boats with attendant prisoners and animals in what is thought to be a tax-collecting tour, the report added. — PTI

## 40 die in Pak in targeted attacks

At least 20 Shia pilgrims were killed and over 30 wounded in a suicide blast targeting three buses near Pakistan's Quetta city on Sunday, police said.

"The suicide bomber targeted three buses carrying the pilgrims in Mastung areas near Quetta. The blast left 20 pilgrims dead and wounded over 30", a police official said. He added that the matter is under probe.

Meanwhile, Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) executed during an attack on a checkpoint on Thursday near Peshawar.

Local Jirga (tribal assembly) members were sent to retrieve the bodies while families have been informed about the incident. Also on Sunday, two soldiers were killed in North Waziristan Agency when an IED exploded.
